

Government of Haryana announces the Make in Haryana Industrial Policy, 2026

12 June 2026

The Government of Haryana has notified the Make in Haryana Industrial Policy, 2026, replacing the Haryana Enterprises and Employment Policy, 2020. The policy seeks to strengthen Haryana’s position as a preferred investment destination by promoting manufacturing competitiveness, attracting large-scale investments, fostering innovation and research, supporting exports, and generating employment opportunities.

Key features of the policy

Validity: The policy came into effect from 26 May 2026 and shall remain in force for five years or until superseded or amended by the Government of Haryana.

Applicability and eligibility:

- New industrial units;
- Eligible expansion and diversification projects undertaken by existing units subject to prescribed investment thresholds and capacity enhancement requirements;
- Units commencing commercial production during the operative period of the policy;
- Standalone R&D units meeting the prescribed investment thresholds;
- Enterprises engaged in Healthcare, Education, Tourism and Hospitality, R&D.
- Ultra Mega, Mega and Large units shall only be provided incentives under this policy.
- MSME units shall be eligible to avail benefits under a separate Haryana Progressive MSME and Export Policy.

Fiscal incentives:

Category	Particulars
Net SGST reimbursement subsidy	Reimbursement of net SGST based on proportion of B2C sales based on certain area based criterias: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Where more than 50% of annual intra state sales are B2C sales in Haryana: 30% - 70% of reimbursement based on area for 7, 10, 12 years for Large, Mega Ultra mega units. Where less than 50% of annual intra state sales are B2C sales in Haryana: 20% - 60% of reimbursement based on area for 7, 10, 12 years for Large, Mega Ultra mega units.
Capital subsidy	Eligible projects may avail capital subsidy ranging from 2.5% to 20% of Eligible Capital Expenditure (ECE), depending on project category, location and commencement timelines. Mega and Ultra Mega Projects may receive customised incentive packages with benefits of up to 30% of ECE.
Stamp duty exemption	Reimbursement of stamp duty ranges from 30% to 100% depending on the location category of the project. Mega and Ultra Mega Projects may avail up to 100% reimbursement under customised incentive packages.
Electricity duty reimbursement	Eligible units may receive reimbursement of up to 100% of electricity duty for a period ranging from 3 to 10 years. Customised packages may extend such benefits for up to 20 years.
Employment generation subsidy	Subsidy linked to employment of Haryana local employees is available for up to 10 years. Benefits may extend up to 100%-120% of the average gross monthly salary, subject to prescribed annual caps.
Incentive for recruitment through Haryana Kaushal Rozgar Nigam (HKRN)	Reimbursement of employer and employee EPF contributions for employees recruited through HKRN, subject to specified monetary limits, for a period of up to five years.

Innovation and R&D incentives:

Category	Particulars
R&D centre incentive	Reimbursement of 50% of capital expenditure (excluding land cost) incurred for establishment of recognised R&D centres. The maximum reimbursement ranges from INR 10 crore for Large Projects to INR 50 crore for Ultra Mega Projects.
Patent commercialisation incentive	Financial incentives of up to INR 50 lakh per successful domestic patent and up to INR 1 crore per successful international patent, subject to prescribed overall caps.
Standalone R&D units	Eligible standalone R&D units are entitled to avail specified incentives under the policy subject to investment thresholds.

Green and sustainability incentives:

Category	Particulars
Carbon credit generation	Incentive of INR 100 per carbon credit generated, subject to an overall cap of INR 1 crore per unit.
Captive renewable energy projects	Financial assistance of INR 50 lakh per MW, subject to prescribed caps based on project category for Mega and Ultra Mega Units.
Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD) systems	Reimbursement of 50% of project cost, subject to a maximum cap of INR 5 crore for Large Units and INR 10 crore for Mega and Ultra Mega Units.
Green building certification	Reimbursement of 2% of eligible building cost, subject to a cap of INR 5 crore per unit.

Government of India scheme linkage: Eligible units availing benefits under central government initiatives such as the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme, semiconductor programmes and other notified schemes may opt for additional top-up support under the policy. The policy allows investors flexibility to choose between State incentives and dedicated support linked to central government schemes.

Our comments

The policy represents a significant shift from traditional industrial incentive frameworks by combining investment-linked support with targeted incentives for employment generation, exports, innovation, sustainability and industrial infrastructure creation. The introduction of customised incentive packages for mega and ultra mega projects provides the state with flexibility to compete for large-scale strategic investments across sectors.

A notable feature of the policy is its emphasis on future-oriented industries such as semiconductors, EVs, renewable energy, green hydrogen and advanced manufacturing, coupled with dedicated incentives for R&D infrastructure, patent commercialisation and export promotion. The policy also seeks to promote balanced regional development through enhanced support for investments in underdeveloped areas of the state.

The availability of customised incentive packages, infrastructure support, export-linked incentives and top-up benefits linked to Central Government flagship schemes may significantly enhance Haryana's attractiveness for large-scale investments. If supported by efficient implementation, timely approvals and continued infrastructure development, the policy could further strengthen Haryana's position as one of India's leading manufacturing and innovation hubs.
