# **COVID-19: Ensuring smooth supply of food products**

In light of the 21-day lockdown announced due to Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, the Department of Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has issued guidelines for State authorities not to obstruct operations/call for closure of food processing units.

# Here's what you need to know



## Food processing companies

- Allowed to keep manufacturing facilities open.Must ensure the strictest safety and
- hygiene standards.
  Distribution and sales channels and food delivery services are exempt from Section 144.

#### Workers and operators

- Those working in the retail outlets and manufacturing units can travel to and from work.
- Adherence to safety norms is necessary.



#### **Groceries and pharmaceuticals**

Allowed to stock, sell, operate to ensure no panic-buying.



#### **Transport vehicles**

The carriers of raw materials to and from food processing units will be given permission in consultation with the local administration.



## Inter-state movement of goods

A process to be put in place to ensure uninterrupted supplies, specifically for e-commerce, food processing, delivery boys and goods trucks.

Availability of raw materials, packaging materials, movement of trucks carrying them, functioning of their warehouses and cold storages and ability of workers to come and work in the factories and warehouses is required for maintaining food supply chain for the general population. The District Collectors, Police and Transport officials have been instructed to enable smooth and continued functioning of the same.
